July Offering Benefits Hunger Initiative

he communion offering for July, which will be observed in worship services July 8 and 9, will be designated for Rise Against Hunger. This ministry is typically the recipient of one of our communion offerings each year. All of the communion money collected for this mission will be used to purchase materials for this ministry.

Rise Against Hunger has worked to serve 79 countries by packaging over 543 million meals. In 2020 alone, the organization impacted 2.8 million lives. Meal-packing events, such as the Super Saturday event planned at White's Chapel this month, are staged to create fortified, dehydrated, shelf-stable meals that are transported to areas identified as being food insecure.

The upcoming event is one that encourages families—especially those with younger children—to serve together in a worthwhile, easily-explained and identifiable mission.

neighbors, [and] existing Bunco groups to join us. This is a way to encourage women to make new friends and talk, while focusing on an activity. Our hope is that if you come alone, you will leave with at least three new friends!"

Participants will gather in Evans Hall at 10 a.m. for a brief welcome and a prayer. Then, everyone will enjoy a tasty brunch provided by the WC Kitchen staff. Items may include pastries, bacon, quiches, etc. After everyone is finished eating, the tables will be cleared to start playing Bunco. Participants will play at tables of four, and prizes will be given out to the winners. The event will

end around 12:30 p.m.

"No knowledge of the game is necessary; we will have an instructional video to teach everyone how we are going to play," Roberson said, encouraging new Bunco players to attend. Bunco prizes will consist of items that have been donated for the event. New, small gift donations are greatly appreciated.

Online registration is important for this event as it requires four players for each game, and there will be a certain number of tables based on registration numbers. Space is limited to 180 women, so people are encouraged to sign up quickly to secure their spot. The cost is \$15 per person, and childcare is available through registration.

"Our Women's Ministry is always looking for new ways to connect with our congregation and to connect the congregation in new ways," Roberson said. "This allows for conversation, discussion, laughter, and fellowship in a light-hearted, laid-back way."


















WC Theater 1—Summer Camp Performance
